

Construction of upgrades and improvements to the City of Camden Morris-Delair Water Treatment Plant, Pennsauken Township, NJ, \$54,994,737.00, were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the NJIB to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits including granular activated carbon filtration vessels for the treatment of PFAS and ultraviolet advanced oxidation equipment for the treatment of 1,4 dioxane for residents and businesses in Camden, NJ.
