- The processing of amendments takes 8-10 weeks. Must be sent to the State of NJ for approval.

## What Amendments Can I do in Camden City?

- Change the spelling of the first and/or middle name of individual who record belongs to:
- If born after 1993 parents listed on the record must sign with valid ID
- If you have baptism papers, school entrance records or immunization papers <u>prior to your 7<sup>th</sup></u> <u>birthday</u> showing your name how you'd like it to be reflected on your Vital Record
- If you have a legal name change from Superior Court
- If it is a parents name that is wrong Valid ID and birth certificate of parent are required to correct this.
- If you do not have a birth certificate, parents can use a marriage certificate, if they were **married before** the birth of the child with valid ID
- We can also use older siblings birth certificates if the parent's name is spelled correctly with valid ID
- <u>**To add a parent</u>** to the birth certificate (for example if one was absent at the time of birth) a Certificate of Parentage must be filled out upon arriving in the office by both parents.</u>
- If an incorrect parent is listed on the record, a DNA test and Order of Paternity from Superior Court is required to correct the parent.
